Throughout 2009-2010 American Heart Association Volunteers and Staff have worked countless hours to bring heart healthy educational programs and materials to the residents of Washington County.

Hospital Community Wellness Programs:

All three hospitals in Washington County – The Washington Hospital, Canonsburg General Hospital and Monongahela Valley Hospital - actively provide wellness programs to the communities that they serve – a major focus is teaching the community about the devastating effects of heart disease and stroke and the important steps that everyone can take to minimize risk factors. The American Heart Association has provided educational materials and resources to support the efforts of these local wellness initiatives, such as patient education materials for health fairs and blood pressure screenings.

Cause Initiatives – Our Community Takes it to Heart!

Go Red For Women Health Initiative — this initiative creates awareness that cardiovascular disease, including stroke, claims more women's lives than the next seven causes of death combined — nearly 500,000 a year, nearly twice as many as all forms of cancer. In Washington County over 1,000 Red Dress pins were distributed to women along with life-saving educational materials to promote this vital awareness campaign.

National Start Walking Day – held in April – hundreds of employees across the county participated in a workplace walking event to promote physical fitness and wellness.

Emergency Cardiovascular Care Programs: CPR – AED – First Aid Training

The American Heart Association's Emergency Cardiovascular Care Programs deliver a dynamic message of hope—the hope of saving lives. New treatments have improved the possibility of survival from cardiovascular emergencies, cardiac arrest, and stroke. These new treatments offer the hope of improved quality of life for people who suffer these events. Increasing public awareness of the importance of early intervention and ensuring greater public access to defibrillation will save many lives. ECC programs educate healthcare providers, caregivers, and the general public about how to respond to these emergencies. Nationally, ECC programs train from 6 to 8 million people every year.
